Academic Article

What is legal design and contract design?

These are some of the topics that Milva Finnegan, Fellow, CPCM, CFCM, CCCM explored in her Ph.D. dissertation, *User-centered design: A key to contract simplification*.

Contracts are a vital part of business-to-business (B2B) exchanges. They guide the exchange relationship and define its terms. A challenge that companies face is the complexity of contract documents. Traditional documents consisting of black and white text without clear headings or paragraph breaks are difficult to read and comprehend. Contracts are not user-friendly! Consequently, businesses spend extensive time and resources on contract negotiations, drafting, and reviewing.

Design thinking in business is emerging in operational management, especially to improve and optimize user experience for economic gains. Design thinking provides flexibility that can be integrated into any activity, both in society and business. Design thinking opens the door to explore how meet people's needs best. Integrating design thinking is essentially focusing on producing *functional products*.




Figure 1. User-centered Design Process

A novel four-phase user-centered design process (Figure 1.) is proposed in the dissertation to develop a contract with a reader first mindset. The key takeaway from the user-centered design process is that it focuses first on what the contracting parties intend to achieve and the context of the business deal. Second, it explores in detail who are the contract users and stakeholders. Once the context and users are defined, the third phase, the design process can start. Applying information, communication, and graphic design methods, common in other fields, helps simplify complex documents. Illustrations and visual depictions, such as, graphs, flow charts, swim lanes, etc., are excellent ways to communicate information to a diverse audience. A key element in a design process is testing and evaluating if the new solution improved the communication; if it did not, the process is iterated.

Contract design shares the same principles as the emerging field of legal design that focuses on making the law accessible to everyone. However, one key difference is that contract design focuses on making a contract usable for the *intended audience*; every person does not use every part of a contract. Rather, the design is tailored based on the user or stakeholder's specific role and the information they rely on to perform their jobs.




Figure 2. Areas of Contract Redesign

The dissertation outlines three specific areas of the contract (Figure 2.) that should be considered during the design process to produce a simplified holistic document. A simplified contract document is structured to help users intuitively navigate it. The language is tailored to the audience. Visualization is incorporated to communicate the information most effectively to a diverse audience.

A well-designed contract that serves as a roadmap throughout execution provides contract management efficiencies, helps avoid disputes, and ultimately creates economic value to businesses.
